WHAT IS IT?

Frysbe is an app where young people can chat with strangers from around the world, share photos and ‘*make new friends.*’

WHAT ARE THE RISKS?

Users press and hold a ‘Frysbe’ where they can see the unique photo, text, video or GIF hidden behind a User Name. The majority of the first 10 ‘most popular Frysbe’s’ (that Perimeter Guardian reviewed) displayed **highly inappropriate content**. The country of each user is displayed.

! PARENT TIPS

Often, we hear phrases like “my child wouldn’t do that” or “he/she knows it’s wrong, I trust him/her” when it comes to internet safety. The reality is, however, that even the most mature or best behaved children can be exposed to inappropriate content, or

be persuaded or pressured to do something they wouldn’t normally do. Having the proper age-appropriate parental controls in place, as well as regular conversations around why we need to be vigilant can help keep your family safe online.

WHAT IS IT?

Txting is an app that allows young people to 'Chat with Strangers' anonymously.

WHAT ARE THE RISKS?

As with any 'Chat with Strangers' enabled apps (that 4 year olds can access) the most dangerous risk is **predators getting in contact with children**. Once these contacts are established, predators have often used blackmail and persuasion to get children to do the unthinkable.

Additionally, the 'Anonymous' feature of the app can lead to **bullying of vulnerable young people**.

Perimeter Guardian has reported this app to Apple, however there are many unchecked apps like it appearing regularly in the App Store and Google Play.

PARENT TIPS

Apps and online gaming are two ways predators can get to children and young people, where they may use a false identity (masquerading as a young person) before using persuasive techniques and finally blackmail to

harness images, bank account details or personal information. Children and young people can become too scared or embarrassed to seek help. Talking to them regularly and reacting calmly may help your kids open up to you.
