As part of this change, the way students will get to school by public transport will change from the beginning of Term 2, 2019 – Monday 29 April. Some students will use different routes, make connections between services or use light rail for the first time. Every student who will use public transport needs to be aware of the changes.

- The change to services will include dedicated school services for the commencement of Term 2 on 29 April 2019.
- The new timetable information will be available on line from early March, including an improved online journey planner.

- Light rail services are being tested now, and you can find out more about safety for pedestrians, cyclists and drivers around light rail online at <u>www.canberra-</u><u>metro.com.au/safety</u>.

Current Years 9-11 2020 Immersion to Cambodia (Parent Information Night – Wednesday 27 March 6.00pm)




