The service operates on a twenty-four hour, seven days a week basis and is located in the ACT and fosters a strong ethos of supporting women to make the best possible choice for themselves. Karinya is a non-government charitable organisation. There are no affiliations to any government agencies or religious institutions and, most importantly, it is a non-judgemental organisation. This is an important point of difference for a lot of women in making the decision to seek help from Karinya. One of the most important insights for those who seek the support of Karinya is that they are all in some kind of crisis, something commonplace in reality.

Canberra's Light Rail Light is fast approaching with testing of the system now happening!

Prior to welcoming passengers on board, the light rail system undergoes a rigorous testing and commissioning process. This important phase of the project ensures the light rail is fully functional and safe to carry passengers.

A key step in this next phase of the project, is the powering up of the light rail's overhead wires with electricity. This is called energisation. After the



overhead wires are energised, light rail vehicles (LRVs) will commence testing on the tracks.

Testing will happen in sections along the light rail alignment, starting towards the Gungahlin end of the line. Light rail vehicle testing will initially be carried out at night at slow speeds. Over time testing will also take place during the day and speeds will gradually be increased. During testing, no passengers will be on board the light rail vehicles.

<u>Stay safe!</u> During the testing period, never attempt to access the light rail corridor and always cross rail tracks at designated pedestrian crossings and intersections. Although the overhead wires are more than 6 metres above the rail track, the wires are LIVE. Always keep a safe distance and never come into contact with the wire.

New signage and extra traffic controls will be in place along the light rail corridor during testing. Please obey all signs and roads rules. The Light Rail Safety <u>video</u> has tips to help everyone stay safe in the light rail environment.

<u>Serving of Alcohol</u>: Alcohol will be available at the function for all patrons over 18 years of age. Alcohol will be available for purchase and consumption at the designated bar area.

<u>Cost</u>: Approx.: \$145 per ticket (all inclusive – venue hire, 3 course meal, live band, photographer) <u>Final Payment</u>: Final payment is due Friday 26 October 2018.

<u>Available Payment Plan</u>: To help families afford Formal tickets the College has opened a 'lay-by' style payment system. Families are welcome to make regular payments between now and Friday 26 October to make the cost of the event more achievable. We highly encourage families wishing to purchase four tickets to take advantage of this payment plan.

<u>Guests</u>: We expect that partners are of an appropriate age and cannot be a current or former Merici College student. Dietary requirements and table allocation will be undertaken electronically later in the year.
