












Father/Daughter Mass and Dinner (Friday 31 August 6.00pm)

This year, the students have decided that all proceeds will be donated to Karinya House Home for Mothers & Babies Inc. Karinya House is a community based organisation providing supported accommodation, transitional housing and outreach services to pregnant and parenting women and their families from Canberra and surrounding regional areas who are in crisis. The service operates on a twenty-four hour, seven days a week basis and is located in the ACT and fosters a strong ethos of supporting women to make the best possible choices for themselves. Karinya is a non-government charitable organisation. There are no affiliations to any government agencies or religious institutions and, most importantly, it is a non-judgemental organisation. This is an important point of difference for a lot of women in making the decision to seek help from Karinya. One of the most important insights for those who seek the support of Karinya is that they are all in some kind of crisis, something commonplace in reality.
