It's been a busy start to the school year and we hope that all students are starting to settle in to their new routines and schedules. As we begin to embark on our academic journey together, we thought that it would be a good time to remind students and their families of some good study habits to set themselves up well to achieve their goals.





One of the common themes that we see in counselling, is a lack of motivation or a lack of drive for schoolwork or study. As your teenager grows older and gains more independence, it can be tempting to pull back in many ways – but its important to stay involved in their life to provide them with the motivation they might sometimes be missing. Sometimes it can be hard to know where to start. simple things like showing an interest in what they learn at school and excitement about their strengths and achievements. It might be helping them break down their assessment task into chunks or allocating specific 'study time' in your daily routine to help them stay on track.

Thousands of deaths have been reported in Türkiye and Syria and the death toll is increasing by the hour. Freezing winter weather is only adding to the devastation, as the thousands left injured, trapped or homeless are stuck in bitter cold and rain.

Merici College will be having a uniform free day (with a suggestion of wearing red items of clothing or accessories in solidarity with the country's national colours).

This will be on Friday of this week (17 February) those participating must bring a gold coin donation - to contribute to a larger donation that will be made on behalf of the school community. The donations will be going to the Caritas Australia Turkey Syria Crisis Appeal. Without a donation, students will be expected to be in full and correct school uniform.

To ensure that this day is as successful as possible, students are required to follow the dress guidelines below.

- All College rules about make-up and jewellery apply on this day.
- Please bring your PE uniform for PE classes.
- Shoulders must be covered and no shoe-string tops, bare midriffs or revealing necklines.
- Skirts and/or shorts should be mid-length or longer: no 'short-shorts' or 'mini skirts'.
- No pyjamas or onesies.
- No 'skins' or tights to be worn instead of trousers or jeans.
- No inappropriate slogans or symbols on clothing or accessories.
- Shoes should be full enclosed and appropriate for activities completed in science laboratories and food and technology lessons.
 - Do not wear any of the following shoe types: ugg boots, thongs or high-heeled shoes.

Year 11 Conference (Wednesday 22 February – Friday 24 February)


The Year 11 Conference is coming next week for three days from Wednesday 22 February to Friday 24 February, to support our new senior students transition into Year 11.
