SRC Feel Good Week (Friday 25 September)




On the last day of Term 3, Friday 25 September, our SRC have organised a day of fun and 'feel good' activities for students to enjoy.

Christian Service Learning Program - Year 8 Project

Year 8 students have started planning their Christian Service Learning Project in the area of Sustainability. All students have received their Reflection Journal and are required to complete their project and submit their completed journal by the end of Week 3, Term 4. If you could please have a conversation with your daughter about her ideas and progress over the coming weeks and encourage her to take progress photos of her project.

Further information: Students are required to complete a total of 12 hours of service with a focus on sustainability: how they can demonstrate stewardship. Students will complete some hours at school and are encouraged to complete 8-10 hours in their own time on their own project at home, in the community or at school. It was reiterated to students to keep the project simple and they may wish to complete a number of smaller projects to accumulate the hours.

Students are watching the Fight for Planet A series and are currently developing ideas for their small project in RE lessons. Students will be credited with time given to research in class for their project and teachers will add this to their record of hours in their journals. House Competition – Beauty Product Package Recycling

The SAM (Sustainability at Merici) team is running a House competition next term. The aim is to collect as many beauty product packages as possible so they can be recycled by Terracycle.

TerraCycle® is a social enterprise Eliminating the Idea of Waste®. Operating in 20 countries, they have found that nearly everything we touch can be recycled and they collect typically hard-to-recycle items through their first-of-their-kind recycling programs. Terracyle have diverted millions of kilograms of valuable resources from landfills all over the world, and say they are just getting started.

What can you recycle?

Recycle any brand of cosmetic, hair care, or skin care packaging. This includes items such as:

- Shampoo bottle caps
- Conditioner bottle caps
- Hair gel tubes and caps
- Hair spray bottles and triggers
- Hair paste plastic jars and caps
- Lip balm tubes
- Face soap dispensers and tubes
- Lotion bottles, tubes, dispensers, and jars
- Shaving foam tubes (no cans)
- Lip gloss tubes
- Mascara tubes
- Eye liner pencils and cases
- Eye Shadow tubes
- Concealer tubes and sticks



Please do not send in aerosol cans, perfume bottles, nail polish bottles, and nail polish remover bottles, electronic items such as blow dryers and straighteners, any bio-medical or bio-hazardous waste or any contents of packaging such as nail-polish, lotion, soap or ointments. Please start collecting any of these items to send in to school during Term 4. Collection boxes will be placed near the offices of our House Coordinators (outside CRLC) – don't forget to place your item/s in your House box to gain House points for the competition.

So please start collecting to reduce waste and recycle our resources!

As you know from past updates, we are recognised as a Specialist Education Provider by the ACT Board of Senior Secondary Studies and this year we are providing courses in French, German, Spanish and Tamil. We may also run programs for Arabic, Indonesian, Italian, Japanese and Korean in 2021, if there are sufficient students interested and if qualified teachers are available. Students can enrol at Continuing and Advanced levels. Senior secondary courses are generally for students in Years 11-12.
