
2021 Marist Merici Year 7 Program


Information - from the Archbishop's Office for Evangelisation

A team from the Archbishop's Office for Evangelisation will be coming to the Marist-Merici Year 7 retreat days to present the Level 1 *Choices, Decisions, Outcomes* personal development program. The 70 minute program includes a whole group presentation and small group discussions lead by trained young adult facilitators.

The topics covered will include:

Unhealthy Dynamics in Friendships and Relationships.
 Students watch short video animations depicting control, clinginess, put downs, isolation etc. Students will have the opportunity (without identifying specific people) to participate in facilitated small group discussions about where they may have seen similar unhealthy dynamics either in films / TV shows or in actual relationships.





2. Healthy Friendships and Relationships

Students participate in an interactive small group exercise with the facilitator drawing out from the students qualities they have observed in people who 'seem to know how to be a good friend': loyal, sense of humour, dependable etc. The conversation is guided toward the importance of respecting boundaries (a pre-cursor to consent education) and being respectful of difference. Students also identify the need to find good friends who share our values. The exercise culminates in the students recognising that even in a future potential romantic relationship the qualities of a good friendship are foundational.



3. Friendship Doll Craft Activity

After two fairly challenging discussion based learning activities the Friendship Doll activity allows the students to relax a little by focussing on a fun but meaningful craft activity. Students choose the wool colours which represent the qualities they might be looking for in a future 'significant other'. They get to take this doll away with them as a reminder of today's learning



Feedback

Time is provided during each program for students & staff to provide feedback on the program so that any problems are readily identified and the team can continuously improve the effectiveness of the program. A written report will be provided to Marist and Merici within a fortnight of delivery of the program.

Program Background

In late 2007, Archbishop Mark Coleridge and the Catholic Education Director, Ms Moira Najdecki, identified a need for an Archdiocesan strategy to promote mature faith formation in students by connecting the Church's teaching on the human person, sexuality and intimate relationships.

In response to this request, the Archbishop's Office for Evangelisation has developed the Intimate Relationships Learning framework which incorporates the establishment of effective intimate relationships and sexual health education that comply with curriculum requirements which involve social and psychological components such as self respect, self-awareness, respect for others, responsibility, self-confidence and decision making tools.

The framework is also consistent with Catholic teaching and will provide direction for education on intimate relationships and sexual health which support the psychosexual, social and spiritual growth of the students as they progress through the different stages of their development to human maturity. The aim will be to provide an integrated approach that brings these different aspects into relationship with one another.

Dear Parent/Guardians




